The "Myrna Brown Program Recognition Award" Myrna Brown has started more Oxford House programs in the state of Washington and beyond. She has been instrumental in our organizational structure like our State Association, Chapters, and workshops. She is one of the biggest reasons why "Washington Leads the Way".

#### Eligibility:

- 1) A program that is initiates innovative approaches to recovery within Clark County
- 2) The program has made significant impact on the recovery community
- 3) declaration of continuing group activities.

The "Cleve Thompson Youth Achievement Award" Cleve has been one of Oxford Houses biggest advocates and an advocate for the recovery community. We also know Cleve has a very big heart when it comes to kids with his many achievements in his personal life.

#### Eligibility:

- 1) An individual under the age of 21, a youth organization, School Program or business.
- 2) Has made a significant impact on underage alcohol and drug abuse prevention, treatment or recovery in their local community and/or school
- 3) Community support is active, visible, and effective.

The "Paul Molloy Lifetime Achievement Award" Paul is our CEO and Co-Founder of Oxford House. Had it not been for Paul who knows where Oxford House would be today. It is his lifetime commitment to Oxford House that we dedicate this award.

#### Eligibility:

- 1) An adult individual who has made a significant countywide impact to the alcohol and drug abuse prevention, treatment, or recovery profession for a minimum of 10 years.
- 2) The nominee demonstrates effective leadership, with genuine concern for improving the humanity of all.
- 3) Unselfish efforts that have inspired others to maintain their commitment to make the community a better place.

- Oxford Houses in Clark County will vote on the winners. One House, One Vote.

#### **Process:**

- 1. Nomination applications sent to houses, alumni, and supporters,
- 2. Applications will be reviewed by Clark County Oxford House City Committee
  - a. The committee will ensure eligibility requirements have been met.
  - b. The committee officers will choose 3 nominees per category to send for final vote
- 3. Final 3 nominations are sent to houses for vote.
- 4. City Committee will tally votes

#### Timeline:

- Nov 15<sup>th</sup> send out nomination applications
- Dec 20<sup>th</sup> Deadline to send in nominations
- Dec 21<sup>st</sup> Review returns and select the final nominations
- Dec 22<sup>nd</sup> send out final nominations to houses
- Jan 10<sup>th</sup> Deadline to send in awards ballot
- Jan 15<sup>th</sup> Tally votes
